PEF Scholarship Information for the Class of 2023

The Prosper Education Foundation scholarship cycle will open on Friday, January 6, 2023 at 8:00 am and will close on Wednesday, February 1, 2023 at 4:00 pm. All Prosper ISD students graduating in the Class of 2023 are eligible for scholarship funds and are encouraged to apply. All applications must be completed and submitted online through the online portal to be considered. Applications are required for ALL PEF scholarships. The application will request information on the student's future college or trade school plans as well as qualifying information from high school. It will also require (1) teacher reference and (1) community member reference. These must be completed through a link in the application.

Applicants, be sure you check back after you have completed all sections to ensure your references have been uploaded to your application. When references are uploaded a green check mark will appear on that section. Once all information is included and there are green check marks by each section, students can submit the application.

Applicants will receive an invitation to our Scholarship Awards Night event via email and mail in early April if they are receiving a scholarship. All students invited to the event, which will be held at Rick Hill High School on May 3rd, are HIGHLY ENCOURAGED TO ATTEND. Applicants will find out their scholarship award at the event. All students will be informed of the outcome of their application in April.

Not all applicants will receive a scholarship. However, 50% of those that applied last year received a scholarship. All are encouraged to apply and do their best work! General essays questions all will complete:

1. What are your personal and career goals for your future? What do you plan to study in college or a trade school and why? (minimum 250 words; maximum 500 words)
2. How has your time in high school impacted you? What did you enjoy? What challenges have you had to overcome, or potential have you realized? (minimum 250 words; maximum 500 words)
3. What is your favorite quality about yourself and why? (minimum 250 words; maximum 500 words)
4. How has your community service within the community impacted you personally? (no minimum)

5. Optional: Please provide any additional information we should know about you. (no minimum or maximum)
